Action: Pam is going to check if the lottery fund money has gone into our bank The website budget is recorded as £20 this will be changed to £200. Action: Pam to alter the website budget. £42 was raised by the refreshments on the Community Day, thanks was given to Carolyn and Jo Britter for their help. 6. **REPORTS ON WORKING PARTIES** At last month's working party the grass was cut and we burnt the foliage and branches of the recently felled oak tree. The incident that occurred with the embers of the fire later on the Sunday was discussed again. We must ensure that fires are left in a safe state in future. This weekend the hedge will have a tidy up and the grass will be cut at the front. It was suggested that the ragwort be left for a couple of weeks as there has not been much evidence of the problem so far. Pam and Julie have said they will help when it needs to be removed. Peter said we also need to look out for hogweed. 7. **SPECIFIC ISSUES** A leg on one of the new benches has been broken, this will need to be made safe. Tony has said that we should write in the In Touch magazine so that people are aware that there has been vandalism on the fields and that we will take action. Julie has said that this will have to be in next month's magazine now. Discussion around how to deter future incidents with smouldering bonfires. Putting up a barrier was suggested but it is still going to be our responsibility to make it safe. Dousing it with water remains the best way of achieving this. Health and Safety: At future working parties we will now ask volunteers to read and sign our Health and Safety Policy. Peter has been trained in health and safety and will give advice and guidance at working parties and Ian reminded the group that all of us just need to be vigilant. Repair of damaged Notice Board: It was decided that if the Parish Council have received the £200 in compensation we will add a further £200 and purchase a board. If the money hasn't been received we will attempt to make a claim on the insurance.
